This year, our Winter Tales American Indian celebration has been expanded to three events. On February 16 at 4:00 PM, Alex will be presenting the talk *Saving the Sacred*. In this presentation, Alex will inform visitors of the efforts to have Hueco Tanks State Park and Historic Site, located near El Paso, Texas, nominated and designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Named for the *huecos*, or natural basins that collect rain water in this desert environment, the site contains over 2000 pictographs and is sacred to the native populations of the area. Admission is free.
